
The Majestic Major, Daimler Story





EXCLUSIVE - SEX SCANDAL ROCKS STAID MOTORING CLUB

Now that we have your undivided attention – here is an important matter for all clubs to consider. It is the Annual General Meeting of The Association of Motoring Clubs on November 27th, 2000. This is the time when a new Committee is elected. Therefore, due to there being only two issues of the Newsletter before the Annual General Meeting (that give sufficient time for clubs to give their thorough consideration), it is time to give some thought to filling those Committee positions that become vacant. Currently the following positions will be vacated:

President – Shane Goodall (Ford Customline Club) has decided that, after two years in this position, it is time to step aside. The reason for Shane's decision is that new ideas and methods are a desirable function of any committee. Shane is prepared to stay on our Committee in another capacity.

Motoring Shows Director – Iain Ross (Bristol Owners Club) has indicated his wish to withdraw from this position. Iain has worked on our Motoring Shows for three years and, through his guidance, has developed them into very professionally conducted events. Iain has offered to provide assistance to the new incumbent for twelve months to ensure a smooth transfer of responsibilities.

Newsletter Editor – Mike Alfrey (Jowett Car Club) has indicated his wish to relinquish this position, he has been our Newsletter Editor since November 1995. Mike has offered to provide assistance to the new Editor of the AOMC Newsletter for twelve months, so that a smooth transfer is achieved.

All of the aforementioned Committee positions require filling at the AGM. It is now time for clubs to actively consider these vacant positions with a view to proposing nominations. It should be remembered that a member of the AOMC Committee does not need to be a club's Delegate. The Constitution of the AOMC allows for Committee members and assistants to be appointed as well as being elected by Delegates.

If the responses to issues that concern our hobby are seen to be professionally instigated and marketed, the media will give our cause the attention it so abundantly deserves. Only then can the AOMC achieve results that are satisfactory to its member clubs.

For the AOMC to continue its growth, and to continue maintaining its presence, proficient support will play a major part. Being a Committee member or a provider of assistance to the AOMC can be a very rewarding experience, and – no matter how small the input, it is very much appreciated.
