IMPORTANT POINTS TO REMEMBER

This page is a summary only, refer to the main text for details.

1. When driving a vehicle on the VicRoads Club Permit Scheme -

The receipted VicRoads Club Permit Certificate and the Special Use Voucher (if applicable) must be carried in the vehicle at all times, AND you are advised to carry in the vehicle:

- (a) a copy of this Handbook and
- (b) a copy of the Club Newsletter or Newspaper or other notice which details of the event.

 (e) Have in place disciplinary measures to control abuses of the Club Permit Scheme.

6. The owner/driver is responsible for maintaining the vehicle in a safe condition. (pp. 8, 9)

7. Left Hand Drive Vehicles -

(pp. 3, 4, 5)

- (a) The driver of a Left Hand Drive (LHD) vehicle on the Club Permit Scheme must hold a full (not probationary) licence.
- (b) LHD vehicles not fitted with headlights which dip to the left must not be driven between the hours of sunset and sunrise.

All British Classics Car Club Requiaments

The club is required to have in place in house rules to govern the manner in which it plays its part in administering the Victorian Club Permit Scheme.

Accordingly the committee proposes to put in place the following...

- 1/ A Club Permit holder MUST maintain CURRENT financial membership at all times. Please note... When your membership is UNFINANCIAL your permit is CANCELED.
- 2/. To avoid being taken advantage of, to be eligible for Club Permit status you must attend a minimum of three events per calendar year. Your permit WILL NOT be renewed if this does not occur.
- 3/ To obtain a permit from Vic Roads you will require either. A full current roadworthy certificate' or a statement on Club letterhead by the ABC roadworthy officer that the vehicle is safe to use on public roads.. Nello Mafodda is our roadworthy officer..
- 4/. The club is required to 'Maintain appropriate systems & checks to ensure that CH plate vehicles are in a safe condition.' Accordingly renewals of the annual Vic Roads permit will also require an inspection by Nello Mafodda PRIOR to the renewal notice being signed by the President, Secretary or Permit officer. It is your responsibility at all times to maintain your vehicle in a safe roadworthy condition.
- 5/. The vehicle may be driven on advertised ABC club events or another authorized clubs advertised events. [Carry written evidence of the event]
- 6/. The act provides that club permit officers, Frank Douglas & Tom Cannon, may issue a special use voucher for any length, route or duration of private social use. But the vehicle cannot be used for hire or reward or for normal work use.
- 7/. Permit holders MUST purchase from the All British Classics Car Club the Permit Scheme Handbook & carry this in the vehicle at all times..

It is proposed to put the above into effect as of 1 August 2001. Should you have any reasonable suggestions the committee would be pleased to consider these..

A PILGRIMAGE TO THE JAGUAR FACTORY UK.

Exerpt from Geoff Entwistle's travel diary for 24 Apl 2001.

10C, Rain & Mist.

After breakfast we decided that a rainy day offered a good opporttunity to visit the Jaguar Museum located at Browns Lane Allesley, only 25 miles from where we were staying.

Jaguar is located in a residential area just outside Coventry and directions to the factory are well signposted for the last 5 miles.

On arrival we could see the JAGUAR sign clearly displayed on a office building but there appeared to be no way through the high security fence. Access was on the other side of the factory via a guarded security entrance. At first there was some reluctance to let us in to see the museum without an appointment until I mentioned the name of the head of P.R. & the Jaguar Car Club.

The immediate reaction to the mention of Australia was a phone call for a factory bus & driver all the way to the door of the Museum which was rather like a car showroom in appearance. The Museum has been run by the Jaguar Heritage Trust, an independent organisation since 1998. Their policy is to acquire, restore & display Jaguar & Daimler cars.

Inside there was a display of approx. Forty immaculate vehicles from an origional Swallow Motorcycle Sidecar, pre WW-2. Models including an SS-100, a graceful Airline saloon & many post war production cars MkVII, C,D & E types, XJS onwards to Xj220, three racing cars in full race paint & a magnificent prototype Daimler convertible, sadly never put into production. There is of course, the usual Jaguar shop but we felt that we were not able to afford any of the items offered at this early stage in our trip. [postcards- 6 for \$18, a mounted mascot for \$200].

After a chat, one of the P.R. Staff revealed that they have acquired a larger collection of 150 cars which are often hired out for film & advertising. He was unsure as to any current plans for these activities but [since we had come specially all this way from Oz] he said he would drive us to this other location. This was of much greater interest. Many of the vehicles have been donated by celebrities & represented the first & last of each production model. Apparently there is no 'S-type' as they are still hoping for a donation. Sorry we cannot oblige. There was however a stretch XJ made for Sir William Lyons & several cars used by the Royals including the Queen Mother [Metallic Red Mk10] and Princess Diana [XJS convertible, also red]. Other interesting items were several prototypes in plastic canopies & a proposed luxury saloon aimed at future production by 2004.

We left with an armful of literature & the good wishes of our hosts in a day we will remember for a long time.
