CLASSIC BRITISH MOTOR CARS ON TELEVISION

Auntie serves up a veritable Feast for Us!

However, all is not a waste of time in television land. Our ABC has three programmes that are worth a look for those who have an interest in British classic motor cars. On Saturday evenings at 7:30 pm there is Kingdom with Stephen Fry as a small town solicitor motoring around in a very nice looking 1960s Alvis 3-litre, and it appears from the endless promotions for the programme that when it is not raining, the Alvis can be seen motoring around Market Shipborough with the hood down - as it should be. The Age Green Guide previews Kingdom with the comment that it will become a Saturday night favourite - a bonus for Alvis lovers and admirers.

But there's more! On Sunday Evenings at 8:30 pm we have Inspector George Gently, a period crime solving series that features, in even more promotions, a very solid-looking Rover P5. I will leave it to the Rover specialists to determine if it is a Series I, II, III or even a 3.5-litre V8 model. Also spotted in the promotions are Hillman Hunter and Ford Corsair – I think. This should be a good one for Rover enthusiasts.

And, finally, there is on Tuesdays at 8:30 pm, The Young Ones in which a group of well-known British celebrities (oldies) come face to face with the lives they led in their heyday. The setting is a mid-1970s fitted out mansion. It seems to be an experiment to find out if the celebrities living in this 'home' feel younger because of their surroundings. No matter, they are even driven out to various places and the mansion in period motor cars. I particularly noticed a very presentable yellow Rover P6 that even had its spare wheel 'left on the boot lid'! Other cars feature are a Morris Marina and, I think again, a Hillman Hunter or Arrow.

All of this is on the very confusingly titled ABC1 (Channel 2). We also managed to find it quite easily on our television set, so it must be easier for others. Enjoy your glimpses of those fine British classics. It looks like our winter won't be so bleak after all!



Everything looked brand new and it was interesting to note that some of the machines were made by Alfa-Laval, a Swedish company famous for its milking machines; and of course for those millions of 20003-B teat-squeezing liners that milk cows and goats around the world. The place was a bit nostalgic for me as, in the early 1970s, I had been involved with baling hay right where the huge new 'factory' now stood.

Rex and Deanna kept us moving as we set off for Trentham Falls, where the restrooms were reputedly less 'interesting' than those at our lunch destination. There was a good flow of water over the falls and, after our break in the drive, we were off for Hepburn Springs. Our destination was the Old Macaroni Factory, which is now a
