The Victorian Club Permit Scheme

The ABCCC Inc. is a club that is authorised by VicRoads to operate vehicles under the Victorian Club Permit Scheme (VCPS). On the Committee there are two VCPS Officers and their contact details are listed above.

Club members will be kept up to date with respect to changes and improvements to the VCPS. However, it cannot be stressed enough, that a vehicle operated on the VCPS, must carry the VicRoads Logbook and Permit (current), the AOMC VCPS Handbook and a copy of *Your ABCCC News* that contains details of the event the permitted vehicle is participating in. All enquiries should be addressed to the VCPS Officers.

THE VICTORIAN CLUB PERMIT SCHEME

NEW PERMIT APPLICATIONS

For members wanting to operate a motor car on the Victorian Club Permit Scheme (VCPS) under the auspices of our club, please contact Nello Mafodda on (03) 9719 7949, who is the ABCCC VCPS Officer In Charge. Nello will be able to provide all the information required to operate a motor car on the VCPS. Nello's position is entirely voluntary, so due consideration should be given when contacting him.

The ABCCC has the following conditions for operating a motor vehicle [twenty-five (25) years old and older] on the Victorian Club Permit Scheme:

- 1. Initial contact should be made with the club's VCPS Applications Officer, currently Nello Mafodda. He will advise the procedure for application with respect to the conditions set by the ABCCC.
- 2. A club member who proposes to place his/her motor vehicle on the VCPS under the auspices of the ABCCC must have been a ABCCC member for more than one year.
- 3. A Roadworthy Certificate must accompany an application for the Victorian Club Permit Scheme under the auspices of the ABCCC.
- 4. A club member who operates a motor vehicle on the Victorian Club Permit Scheme, under the auspices of the ABCCC, must attend a minimum of three (3) club events per year. The car does not have to attend three events, just the owner. Excluded from the count are the Annual Winter Luncheon and the Christmas Luncheon events.
- 5. VicRoads requires a permit holder to be in good financial status in order to drive the car under this Permit.
- 6. The ABCCC will notify VicRoads when a permit holder becomes an unfinancial member.
- 7. The ABCCC will maintain a Register of those Motor Vehicles operated on the Victorian Club Permit Scheme under the club's conditions. Such Register will be submitted to VicRoads upon request.
- 8. The motor vehicle operated under the Permit Scheme should be used within the spirit of the motor vehicle club scheme.

PERMIT RENEWALS

VicRoads requires that an ABCCC authorised VCPS Officer's signature is entered on the permit renewal notice. Therefore, your VCPS renewal should be sent to Colin Brown, PO Box 40, Coldstream, Victoria 3770. Enclose with it a stamped envelope addressed to VicRoads, along with a cheque/money order for the VCPS fee. Colin will sign on behalf of the ABCCC, and then forward the permit renewal on to VicRoads. The form also requires YOUR signature, so be sure to sign it as the permit holder as well.

Colin's position is entirely voluntary, so due consideration should be given when contacting him.

A SURVEY CONDUCTED IN BRITAIN

A Précis Of The Results Of The FBHVC Survey

The Federation of British Historic Vehicle Clubs (FBHVC) has measured the value of historic vehicle related activity in UK twice – in 1997, and in 2006. In May 2011, FBHVC – working with the Historic Vehicle Research Institute (HVRI), embarked on the process of surveying individuals, the trade, clubs and specialist museums with a view to bringing the 2006 data about the extent of the historic vehicle movement up to date.

The information-gathering process closed at the end of August and analysis of the data was completed in November. The results were presented to members of the All Party Parliamentary Historic Vehicle Group (APPHVG); and the press and representatives of the specialist trade at a reception in the House of Lords on 6th December 2011. This was hosted by Lord Montagu of Beaulieu, President of both FBHVC and APPHVG. Amongst those attending was Mike Penning MP, Under Secretary of State at the Department for Transport with responsibility for Road Safety.

The research programme looked into five main areas: economic value; employment; number and use of historic vehicles; social activity; and concerns for the future. The title of the report, 'The £4 Billion Hobby', shows the overall headline result. Other findings include:

- £4.3 billion overall value
- Nearly £1 billion in exports Over 28,000 people employed
- 57% of businesses are over 20 years old
- 850,000 historic vehicles
- 82% of historic vehicles are used no more than twice a month
- Historic vehicle are responsible for less than 0.24% of overall traffic
- 68% Of historic vehicles are valued at less than £10,000
- 4.5 million person-attendances a year at events organised by FBHVC clubs
- 52% of traders expect their businesses to grow in next 5 years

The research project was led by FBHVC Vice President Geoff Smith and was carried out by Dr Paul Frost, Dr Chris Hart and Dr Jaime Kaminski of the Historic Vehicle Research Institute with background administrative and editorial assistance from past FBHVC secretary Jim Whyman.

SOME HANDY TIPS FOR MODERN TIMES

E-Mail Tracker Programmes

The source of this information is a computer technician. He spends a lot of time clearing the junk off computers for people and listens to complaints about slow computer operating speeds. It should be noted that not all requests to forward E-mails are bad, just some of them. He sent the following:

By now, I suspect everyone is familiar with <u>snopes.com</u> and/or <u>truthorfiction.com</u> for determining whether information received via E-mail is just that — true/false or fact/fiction. Both of them are excellent sites.

Some advice that may work for you.

- When you see an E-mail that instructs you to, 'forward this on to ten (or however many) of your friends', 'sign this

 send it', or, whatever it almost always garbage. Even when you get E-mails that demand you send the E-mail
 on if you're not ashamed of God/Jesus they are playing on our conscience and it is a waste of time. Ignore
 them and don't participate.
- 2. In addition: E-mail petitions are not acceptable to government or any other organisation, CentreLink, etc. To be acceptable, petitions must have a 'signed signature' and the full address of the person signing the petition, so this is a waste of time.

You can do your friends and family members a great favour by sending this information to them. You will be providing a service to your friends. And you will be rewarded by not getting thousands of spam E-mails in the future. Do yourself a favour and stop adding your name(s) to those types of listing, regardless how inviting they might sound, or make you feel guilty if you don't.

Another important tip is to delete all previous names from your E-mails before forwarding. Send E-mails to your entire address list as BCC, then everyone after you don't get your friend's E-mail address.

Tips for Handling Telemarketers

Three little words that really work:

1. The three little words are: 'Hold on, please . . .'

Saying this, while putting down your phone and walking off (instead of hanging-up immediately) would make each telemarketing call so much more time-consuming that boiler room sales would grind to a halt.
