NEWS FROM THE FEDERATION

Sunday, 10th December 2017

The meeting was hosted by the Rootes Group Car Club and held at the Don Kyatt Group of Companies at 245 Sunshine Road, Tottenham.

Our Club was represented by Bill Allen. We were broken up into groups for a tour of this vast complex. I was fortunate enough to be in the group led by Frank Hutchinson, the owner of the business. Frank was an excellent guide and of course knew the place backwards.

We were shown the bottling of Flash Lube; which they export all over the world; their huge array of over 45,000 spare parts for four wheel drive vehicles; their Evalife alkaline mineral water- enriched with magnesium bicarbonate which is sold through health food shops; and finally the "100% All Natural Organic" range of coconut product. Frank stated that the last two ranges of products were introduced as hobbies for the staff! The factory tour took a good two hours to complete and was most interesting. They moved into these premises about four years ago. They were previously the home of Ryco Filters and the GUD range of products prior to them moving those manufacturing facilities off shore - to China presumably.

After the tours we all enjoyed an excellent lunch provided by the Rootes Group Members, all washed down with some of Frank's excellent water of course.

Federation President, Neil Athorn opened the meeting. Murray Downes of the Rootes Group Car Club told us that the Club was founded in 1959, and told a few words about the Company. He stated that this was the largest group ever to visit his premises and enthusiastically welcomed everybody.

After his mother had a heart attack he started working for the National Bank, which he did not like but stuck it out for 4 years. He then went to work at G V Clarke Motors, which later became Cheneys. They were Bedford distributors. It was here that he met Don Kyatt, who was twenty years older than Frank. They decided to go into business and with an initial capital of \$300.00 each, selling parts for Bedford buses. They still stock some of these parts. Frank bought Don out after which he died soon. Now nearly 50 years later he moved on to Landrover then Toyota parts. He believes that service is the key factor and always tries to give the best possible service. They now have over 140 employees, with 4 over 70 and 10 over 65. Frank is 72 years old. He has a passion about saving and improving things and always tries to help his customers as much as possible. He bought the formula and Flash Lube name from a retired German engineer. Their current factory is perfect for their purpose, situated on around 11 hectares of land. His small family owned company even sells to Exxon - one of the largest companies in the world. He said it is very hard work but he finds it most enjoyable. In fact he just arrived back from New Guinea this morning. His wife works at the Mercy Hospital and his son, now 37, works with him in the company.

Neil thanked Frank and his staff for all that they had done and congratulated him on the success of his company and handed over a Certificate and Federation Cap and two books supplied by the RACV.

Some interesting points raised at the Meeting were:-

- * The 2018 Open Rally after the next Delegates' Meeting.
- * The Golden Oldies tour will take place in March/April 2019 and Organiser, John Davis advised that it is 90% organised. It will take place in the Mountain Area and is for cars built between 1919 and 1930.
- * The Australia Day Display in Kings Domain, an invitation only event, attracted 46 Veteran vehicles. The Federation organiser in previous years John Kennett, is to have a major operation on Wednesday. His wife Robyn broke her hip when knocked over by a runaway foal.
- * The AHMF National Motoring Heritage Day is scheduled for May this year. Further details will follow.
- * The next edition of Fed News will be the one hundredth and we are hoping for a bumper issue. Clubs are encouraged to make contributions for this special edition. Long time Editor, Mal Grant is going to write an article for this edition.
- * Nothing has developed with VicRoads since the last meeting regarding the CPS Scheme.
- * The Federation is arranging a meeting with the future of clubs, modified vehicles, the need to make meetings more streamlined and to establish if all the rules regarding incorporation are all really necessary, to be discussed.
- * Nominations for the Robert Shannon Trust close on 30th June 2018. Delegates were encouraged to nominate suitable young club members.
- * There is a desperate need to attract younger members to the Federation's committee.
- * Next year will see Vintage cars becoming Veterans as they will be 100 years old in 2019. It is proposed to strike a badge for this auspicious event. A badge maker in WA is likely to be the manufacturer of this badge.
- * Daryl Meek of the RACV stated that whether we like it or not, nothing much will change with Australia Day Display at Kings Domain. This is mainly due to the continual threat of terrorism. It was suggested the Federation submit a proposal to become involved again with this event and, hopefully, increase the number of cars attending. This is be Investigated further
- * Daryl also stated that an incident took place at the Event which did not show the old car movement in a good light. An uninvited random veteran vehicle turned up at the display; drove dangerously through the crowd of pedestrians; parked with the invitees; and stayed for a short time, then exited in the same dangerous manner. Further action is to be taken with the driver who, is apparently, known to the organisers.
- * Ashley Gray will again be in charge of organising the Bendigo Swap Meeting. It was noted that the car boot sale was not a success and would be dispensed with next year. However the show and shine proved successful and will feature again this year. The new system introduced at the gates this year caused a few bottlenecks and will need to be refined for this year's Swap. Ashley said that while all the figures in were not yet, every indication is that the 2017 Swap will be a great success. To date 90% of sight holders have rebooked. The Swap magazine was again excellent. Unfortunately some people tried all sorts of tricks to gain entry without paying sounds familiar RE: GAR! There are still places available for Club Corner. Caterers, by necessity, will need to be changed this year. It takes around 200 Volunteers to run the Swap and more are needed. Neil is stepping back this year. At the next meeting the revenue raised will be reported. It is likely to be similar to the successful 2016 result.
- * It is important that Delegates' current email address is given to the Federation.
- * It is likely the 2020 AHMF Tour will start from the Don Kyatt premises and that old four wheel drive vehicles will be encouraged to participate.
- * The next One and Two Cylinder Tour will travel to Cobram.
- * The second RACV Florence Thompson Tour where all drivers must be women, will be on the 22nd April 2018 with travel to the RACV Resort in Creswick. Currently, there are 210 expressions of interest resulting from an article in

Royalauto. A maximum of 250 entries will be accepted with bookings closing 3rd March 2018. This event is only promoted through the AOMC and the Federation.

* While the Federation is not currently supporting the reduction or removal of the Luxury Car Tax as the Committee feels it is not an appropriate thing for it to be involved with, there was considerable discussion on the subject. Douglas Young has prepared a 97 page proposal for its removal for presentation to the Australian Government. It is hoped that a positive outcome will result from this submission.

* Treasurer, Brett Holloway, stated that dues were due. Copies of Fed News were made available.

THE REMARKABLE TRAVELS OF RMC RILEY ST-029

I began my time in the Wedding Car Industry with two RM series 2.5 litre Rileys. The 1948/9 model had been owned by two nuns from Shepparton and it only had 31,000 miles on the 'clock'. It even came with a receipt for the first petrol put in the tank - 14 shillings and 9 pence. Being an early entrant into the industry when there were very few specialty vehicles for hire, the fleet quickly expanded. First another 2.5 litre RM sedan and then the 2.5 litre RMC or "Drop Head Coupe

The Drop Head came as a 'basket case' from a Mr Eddy Ashby of Wesburn. A quick trip down to Bill Bonner's workshop and ST-029 was ready for work as the pride of the fleet.

I ran the cars for a number of years but as I was still teaching full time, eventually, it became a little too much so I decided to sell all four cars. The advertisement came out

about lunchtime on a Thursday and by 6.00pm they had sold. Suddenly I thought "What have I done?" It was about the time of the mining boom in Western Australia so the money was flowing. A building developer had started a motor

museum in the basement of one of his 'high rise' projects.



couple of 2.5 litre Roadster (one floor shift and one column shift) versions as the main display. the week a large fully covered four car transporter arrived and off the four Rileys went to their new home in Perth, Western Australia.



I thought that would be the last I ever heard of them especially the DHC which I have always regretted selling, but then, about eighteen months ago, I had an email from a fellow who lived in Perth. It seems that the motor museum had gone bust, possibly due to the GFC, and the collection had been broken up. He had purchased what we affectionately always called "The Nun's Car". He told me that the cars had, for many years, been known around the traps as the wedding cars and it was while he was thoroughly detailing the vehicle that he found one of my very old business cards. Just 'on spec', he searched the web, found our website and had sent me an email wanting to know

what history I had on the cars. Eventually, I sent him the original handbook along with the receipt for the first petrol for which he was very appreciative. I then asked him if he knew what had happened to the rest of the cars. It was then that a great story unfolded.

He was able to tell me that the sedans had found new homes with other club members, but the really interesting story was about the Drop Head Coupe. It seems that he had been on a business trip to the States and was on his way home. His flight was delayed in Singapore so he decided to spend a little time in a local bar. Sitting next to him was a gentleman from Denmark and so they started chatting. Soon the topic came around to cars and it turned out that the gentleman's passion was 2.5 litre Rileys. He had a restored 2.5 litre RMF but his wife had always wanted a Riley DHC. He had searched Europe



but hadn't found anything suitable. Paul then told him about ST-029 being up for sale in Perth. Immediately, a phone call was made and sight unseen the DHC was purchased. In very quick time the car was placed on a 747 cargo plane and whisked off to Denmark. It turned out that the gentleman was the Ambassador of the Danish Royal Court to the whole of South East Asia and had mega manufacturing businesses throughout the region. Once home, he had sent the car off to England for a precautionary engine rebuild but being dissatisfied with the progress, had it flown to Germany for a total mechanical rebuild. It was here that his wife decided that she would like the colour changed from Riley Cream to Old English White. (A mistake I thought) However it then went home to live in a temperature controlled, hermetically sealed, purpose build garage, perched on a specially built stainless steel hydraulic hoist. Whew! Sometime later, the Ambassador made contact with me, thanking me for the well presented Drop Head and sent me photos of one of the four royal Danish weddings he has participated in with the car. He and his family love the Riley and intend never to let it out of their grasp. So ends the story of my much loved Riley Drop Head Coupe and its remarkable world travels. Or does it?

2018 ROB ROY

CORRESPONDENCE: There was no correspondence.
