Up with the phone, punch in a number and, guess what? Car is in Mildura, we are not. Wife then says we should go to Mildura as we hadn't much planned for the day. Violent braking, screaming of tortured tyres as a 'U' turn was completed to the dismay of the following and oncoming traffic. Up the drive, pack a bag - back in car - gone. Wife asks why do we need a bag? Driver shows map, points out Mildura. Wife says, "you're jokin?" Driver says "It's only 3:15 pm.
