ABCCC is a VicRoads authorised Club to participate in the VicRoads Club Permit Scheme (CPS)

The ABCCC has set rules & conditions for operating a motor vehicle [twenty-five (25) years old and older on the CPS, for further information about how the CPS is conducted by the All British Classics Car Club please visit the club's Website Link ABCCC Club Permit Scheme information All the information is available online.

- 1. **Initial contact** should be made with the club's Vehicle Logbook Club Permit Scheme (VLCPS) Applications Officer, currently Wally Thompson. He will advise the procedure for application with respect to the conditions set by the ABCCC. He must also provide a first inspection of the vehicle.
- 2. **PERMIT RENEWALS** VicRoads requires that an ABCCC authorised VLCPS Officer's signature is entered on the permit renewal notice. Therefore, your VLCPS renewal should be sent to Colin Brown, PO Box 40, Coldstream, Victoria 3770. Enclose with it a stamped envelope addressed to VicRoads, along with a cheque/money order for the VLCPS fee. Colin will sign on behalf of the ABCCC, and then forward the permit renewal on to VicRoads. The form also requires YOUR signature, so be sure to sign it as the permit holder as well.

Both Wally & Colin's position are entirely voluntary, so due consideration should be given when contacting them.


Hi Guys don't forget our classy day out – we have room for more starters, hope you can make it!



All British Day at Echunga South Australia – 3rd March 2024

Article by Glenda Prewett. On a recent trip over to South Australia with Richard & Barbara Wellard, we joined the Gawler Veteran, Vintage and Classic Vehicle Club for the 'All British Day' annual event.

What started out as a picnic day, is now known as the All British Day in the small town of Echunga about 34klms from Adelaide. This event is held annually, this year celebrating their 40th Year. Each year they showcase in the middle of the ground a marque vehicle, this year was the MGs from 1924 to 2004, along with another great celebration - 90 year anniversary of the South Australia Sporting Car Club.

The day was perfect and it was a lovely Sunday for a run through the hills to Echunga. There were approx. 900 cars, including a few tractors, a couple of Trucks, a few wooden boats, stationary engines & early motorcycles – something for everyone. It was a great display and realising that most of these marques on display are no longer manufactured, just now its part our history! It was pretty amazing.

The London Cab on display had a great history and incredible story, London to Sydney taxi ride to break the world record. In 2011 three friends from the UK went to the pub and decided to drive a black cab around the world. Yes around the World, its an incredible story.

We were welcomed by the folks of the Gawler car club and there were some great cars. I picked out one car that I liked.

It was something different but familiar looking.

It was a Riley Elf. At first glance I thought it was a Mini. What do you think?

When I got home, I found an article to share with you. "The Quirky Riley Elf"

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The Quirky Riley Elf – The "Other" Classic Mini

Extracted from Silodrome Gasoline Culture, this article was written by Ben Branch in July 2023

The Riley Elf is a little-known car that was based on the Morris Mini, it shared a similar body to the Wolseley Hornet, and both cars were offered as more luxurious stablemates to the original Alec Issigonis-designed Mini that took the world by storm. The Elf has the same underpinnings as the Mini but it has a unique body, with a longer rear end and a reworked front to give it a more "Riley" appearance. The interior was upgraded too, but thankfully the performance and handling was all classic Mini.



Fast Facts - The Riley Elf

- The Riley Elf was developed by British Motor Corporation (BMC) and introduced in 1961 as a variation of the Morris Mini. It was designed by Alec Issigonis, the creator of the original Mini, with the aim of offering a more upscale and luxurious version of the popular compact car.
- The Riley Elf featured a slightly elongated rear body section, giving it a distinctive appearance notably different to the Mini. This design modification also provided additional cargo space. The exterior of the car featured a number of upscale touches, like the redesigned chrome grille and additional chrome accents.
- The Riley Elf's cabin boasted luxurious features by Mini standards, including wood veneer dashboards and plush upholstery. It reflected the desire of BMC to market the car as a more expensive alternative to the best-selling Mini.
- The Elf offered a range of engine options, all various versions of the BMC A-Series engine. These engines delivered the same power output as the comparable Mini versions of course. The Elf's lightweight Mini-based construction, coupled with its hydrolastic suspension system, provided the same nimble handling as its more famous sibling.
- While the Riley Elf enjoyed moderate success during its production run, it gained recognition and status as a classic car in later years. Its rarity, unique looks, and its combination of elegance and driving fun have attracted the attention of classic car enthusiasts who might otherwise have bought a classic Mini.
- The Riley Elf was first introduced in 1961 as a variation of the Morris Mini Minor, a compact car that had taken Britain (and the world) by storm. The Elf was designed by Alec Issigonis, the mastermind behind the original Mini, and produced by British Motor Corporation (BMC), which later became part of British Leyland.

Update on Tony's very British Mark V project

Jaguar MKV Restoration Report April 2024

Not a lot of progress in the last couple of months but quite a bit since the last report mostly at the rear end. First I had to decide does the petrol tank go before the spare wheel locker or after? Does it go in from under or through the boot? As always having not pulled it apart I chose the wrong one but it is now all sorted, the tank is now connected to the pump and carburettors just waiting for the price of petrol to drop so I can test it for leaks. Next in was the boot floor with luggage rails plated and new rubbers side walls vinyl covered and rear wall fitted. Next came the fitting of the boot lid, normally requires four men to fit but with a little ingenuity I managed. Lastly the toolbox which goes within the boot lid and the back end is finished.

At the front end I fitted and wired the instrument panel after first sorting all the bits of metal brackets from the big box of unknown parts. I installed the radiator and grill and a lot of engine components, distributor, coil, generator starter motor etc.

The big hold up on the engine has been the rocker shaft, I sourced one in the UK and asked them to send me the invoice, following day they told me it was sold the day before, this from a company I have established a good relationship. I was told by a local Jaguar specialist he had one in his spare parts containers but after many phone calls it never happened. So I took my last resort, I made one, now I do have a strong engineering background and I do have a lathe and milling machine in my home workshop but I could write a book on the problems I had in drilling a ¼ inch hole through a two foot long silver steel shaft.

If everything goes to plan I should be starting the engine within the couple of weeks Tony Pettigrew
