This car was imported new into Queensland in 1970 and had three owners in that state. In 1986 it was brought to Victoria by the fourth owner and purchased by the present owners in 1996. The car is almost completely original and has been carefully maintained over the years. It has the original owners handbook, service book and tool kit.

HISTORY

The Lotus Elan Roadster was introduced in 1962 and was joined by the Larger Lotus Elan Plus 2 (2 occasional seats in the back) in 1967 intended for the Lotus driver with a young family. In Late 1968 the model was updated and made more luxurious and designed a Plus 2S (the first production car by Lotus not made available as a kit car). In 1971 the engine was upgraded to 126BHP and the model became a Plus 2S 130. In 1973 the car came with an optional 5 speed gearbox and production ceased in 1974.
