tech warning for everybody

"Fire Damaged Motor Parts"

Mr. Paul Walters, the Executive Director of the TACC, recently drew the attention of the motor trade to a hazard that could cause the loss of a limb to any person who inadvertently comes in contact with fire damaged motor vehicles or spare parts.Mr. Walters quoted from a NRMA technical bulletin which issued a grim warning about "Vitron", a material found in head gaskets, O-rings, oil seals, drive belts and electrical items.

Vitron is a fluoro-clastomer, or, in lay terms, a synthetic rubber-like material containing fluorine. When subject to temperatures above 600 deg C, Vitron can partially decompose into highly dangerous hydrofluoric acid. At this stage, the melted substance looks like a black sticky mass where the hydro-fluoric acid may have condensed as a clear liquid onto the burnt part of adjacent equipment. The acid is extremely corrosive and almost impossible to remove-especially from human tissue. What is a real concern is that in dilutes form, the acid dose not cause any burning or stinging sensation when it comes in contact with the skin.

The first thing that the unfortunate victim is aware of is the appearance of a small bloached area on the skin, some hours after initial contact. By this time the acid has leached into the internal tissue and has eaten away the bone mass. The best that can be expected at this point is for the exposed area to be amputated.

So, before carrying out any work on fire damaged vehicles or stock, a check for decomposed drive belts hoses, seals or gaskets, which appear as a "charred or black sticky mass". Under no circumstances touch either the component or surrounding area. Decontaminate the affected areas by cleaning with wire wool and detergent and make sure that you wear heavy-duty neoprene or plastic gloves and heavy-duty overalls.

Distance from Berwick is approx 180 km so bring your Classic & come & join us on a great outing. Inquiries, Ross at 5975 0970.


WHALE WATCHING TOUR WEEKEND


