

WOULD YOU LIKE A GLASS OF COKE

- 1. In many states of America, the Highway Patrol carries two gallons of coke in the truck to remove blood from the highway after a car accident.
- 2. You can put T-bone steak in a bowl of coke in the fridge and it will be gone in two days.
- 3. To clean a toilet: Pour a can of coca-cola into the "bowl and let the real thing" sit for one hour, then simply flush clean. The citric acid in the coke removes stains from vitreous china.
- 4. To remove rust spots from crome bumper bars: Rub the bumper with a rumples piece of aluminium foil dipped in coca-cola. It will also clean road haze from your windshield.

Let me ask the title question again: Would you like a glass of water or coke?


