EVENT REPORTS

2012 RACV FLY THE FLAG 'HERITAGE' TOUR - 17th to 23rd March 2012

Started in a Rover 3500; finished in a Saab 340!

Unless someone who completed the Tour writes a report, this report will cover events as far as the second night at Mount Gambier. It was at that point that RACV Total Care swung into action after the failure of a front wheel bearing on *Pea Soup*. Up to that point, we enjoyed another successful Tour. There were no rental cars available in town, in fact Budget had six of its cars stranded in Adelaide! So, we were accommodated for a third night in Mt. Gambier and booked on a morning flight home – hence the Saab bit. If Saab built their cars the same way they build their aeroplanes, they must be guite something. Next morning we were collected by a cab and taken to the airport.

The Saab 340, with its lady pilot at the helm, taxied to the runway at an impressive rate of knots, swung onto the main runway and then it was, whoosh, and we were off the ground in a most extraordinarily short distance. Last time I flew out of the Mount, was in a fully laden Fokker Friendship that laboured its way all the way along the runway to lift off just before the bitumen ran out. The flight was very comfortable and QANTAS and Virgin, et al, could learn a thing or two about seating comfort from Regional Express (REX).

Another cab met us at Melbourne airport and soon we were home. I had been advised that the car could take several weeks to be transported home. It arrived on a tilt-tray a day less than a week. RACV Total Care, and particularly a lass called Yasmin, certainly ensured a stress-free journey home for us and *Pea Soup*. Now all that remains to be done is for me to make a good repair – with a suitably durable amount of bearing grease in the hub!

The RACV Fly The Flag Tour for this year can be described as another successful Tour. There were a number of familiar faces missing, but those places have been filled with new Flaggers and, importantly, interesting motor cars to view at our display stops.

The Tour

It was a fine morning, with just a few spots of rain, as we set off from the Ultima Function Centre in East Keilor for the start of our Heritage Tour. It was a cautious, but easy run along the Western Ring Road and on past Geelong on the newly-provided super-bypasses. Our first stop at Winchelsea for a visit to Barwon Park was reached much sooner than expected. The grounds and mansion were looking fabulous in the late summer after the amount of rain the month before. There were guided tours of the mansion and we could see a most interestingly preserved interior. We partook of a picnic luncheon in the grounds and then it was on our way to Warrnambool.

This was to be our base for two nights. Dinner was at the Greyhound Track with it also being our RACV Community Foundation Auction Night. It was a quick auction, conducted by Colin Brown and there were some bargains easily sold. We raised a reasonable sum for the Foundation. Next morning the Tour took us to Princeton (Princetown) on the Great Ocean Road and a very pleasant stop was made at Port Campbell for morning tea. It was satisfying to note that the tea was stronger than on a previous visit! We continued on our loop tour and enjoyed our picnic lunch at a little reserve in Timboon. Then it was back to base in Warrnambool.

Dinner was a superb barbecue in the grounds of the Flagstaff Hill Maritime Museum. The soft evening light was perfect and the real highlight for most of us was the firing of the cannon. This was carried out with the full

On stopping to investigate, nothing was immediately obvious and, because the road was busy with late afternoon traffic, we continued, slowly, the nine kilometres to The Barn.
