#### \*\*Extract from the archives Australian Food timeline

No doubt to the annoyance of the brand's owners, the term 'Esky' is widely used in Australia as generic term for a portable cooler box. The original Esky ® Auto Box was released by Malleys in 1952. It was the first of its kind in Australia, although there were similar products already available in the US. The brand name was registered in 1961.

In fact, Esky branded products had been around for many years by then. The history of Malleys, the makers of the Esky ®, goes back to 1884 when Francis Malley started his sheet metal working

business in Sydney. The Malley business expanded over the years, even opening its own chain of hardware stores. During WWII the company produced food containers, ammunition boxes and other items for the military.

#### Presidents Report May 2023

Life is slowly returning to normal after four weeks in Tassie and two weeks getting the garden back into condition after a few weeks of neglect. Tassie is fast fading into the distant past but on reflection the highlight of the club trip was the Arthur River Cruise. I was advised in the early planning stages to apply for a tourism grant from the Tassie Government which I did, we ticked all the boxes, over 40 people, a lot of days outside Hobart, two days in Smithton and two days in Orford all counted and two days before departure we received a grant of \$4600 to cover organisation and operating expenses. I decided to use this money for the Arthur River Cruise at \$110 per person except for me I was already free as Tour Leader but ces't le vie, the balance went towards everybody's dinner in Derwent Park.

As you are aware particularly if you were at the AGM the committee have asked for suggestions on what to do with our surplus funds, some of those suggestions are thought provoking and some are totally misinformed but at this stage they have not been discussed by committee so I won't go down that path. But it is very disconcerting that there are a lot of members who are totally ignorant of why we have excess funds and some believe it is because our membership fees are too high!

For those who don't know let me explain. In the early days of this club around 1998 we organised the Great Australia Rally after it's fore runner organised by the Armstrong Siddely Car Club in 1991-3 (that's where the roots of our club was formed) proceeds went to Peninsular Health and continued for the next three years before we switched to PeterMac for the rest of Great Australian Rally's. We have raised \$1,000,000plus for PeterMac. Over these years we deducted our operating costs and other expenses which were paid into the Club account. While this was happening we were also providing a dedicated bunch of volunteers to organise the car parking, prepare and sell food and drive the train and sell tickets at Como Gardens Open days, twice a year for four days total. For that we received \$2000 a year into the Club account. From 2002 to 2018 we organised the Fly the Flag Tour for a fee of \$2000 paid into the Club account and when the FTF finished there was just under \$20000 in the FTF bank account which was transferred into the Club account. I would like to add when I became president in 2008 the bank balance was approximately \$8000, Bill became Treasurer a couple of years later and with good fiscal management and hard working volunteers, we built the bank balance to what it is today. (All figures and dates are from memory and may not be exact)

Finally, in June we have the Hamilton Rally, we have quite a large attendance from the Club with 22 rooms booked at the Grangeburn and a few others spread around town. I have organised a catch up and lunch stop at the Golden Age Hotel in Beaufort for lunch and dinner at Alexander House in Hamilton on the Friday night at 7.00pm I need to know numbers so **PLEASE** let me know. The rest of the weekend is as per the rally program.

ABCCC is a VicRoads authorised Club to participate in the VicRoads Club Permit Scheme (CPS)

The ABCCC has set rules & conditions for operating a motor vehicle [twenty-five (25) years old and older on the CPS, for further information about how the CPS is conducted by the All British Classics Car Club please visit the club's Website Link <u>ABCCC Club Permit Scheme information</u> All the information is available online.

- 1. **Initial contact** should be made with the club's Vehicle Logbook Club Permit Scheme (VLCPS) Applications Officer, currently Wally Thompson. He will advise the procedure for application with respect to the conditions set by the ABCCC. He must also provide a first inspection of the vehicle.
- 2. **PERMIT RENEWALS** VicRoads requires that an ABCCC authorised VLCPS Officer's signature is entered on the permit renewal notice. Therefore, your VLCPS renewal should be sent to Colin Brown, PO Box 40, Coldstream, Victoria 3770. Enclose with it a stamped envelope addressed to VicRoads, along with a cheque/money order for the VLCPS fee. Colin will sign on behalf of the ABCCC, and then forward the permit renewal on to VicRoads. The form also requires YOUR signature, so be sure to sign it as the permit holder as well.

Both Wally & Colin's position are entirely voluntary, so due consideration should be given when contacting them.


