ABCCC is a VicRoads authorised Club to participate in the VicRoads Club Permit Scheme (CPS)

The ABCCC has set rules & conditions for operating a motor vehicle [twenty-five (25) years old and older on the CPS, for further information about how the CPS is conducted by the All British Classics Car Club please visit the club's Website Link ABCCC Club Permit Scheme information All the information is available online.

- 1. **Initial contact** should be made with the club's Vehicle Logbook Club Permit Scheme (VLCPS) Applications Officer, currently Wally Thompson. He will advise the procedure for application with respect to the conditions set by the ABCCC. He must also provide a first inspection of the vehicle.
- 2. **PERMIT RENEWALS** VicRoads requires that an ABCCC authorised VLCPS Officer's signature is entered on the permit renewal notice. Therefore, your VLCPS renewal should be sent to Colin Brown, PO Box 40, Coldstream, Victoria 3770. Enclose with it a stamped envelope addressed to VicRoads, along with a cheque/money order for the VLCPS fee. Colin will sign on behalf of the ABCCC, and then forward the permit renewal on to VicRoads. The form also requires YOUR signature, so be sure to sign it as the permit holder as well.

Both Wally & Colin's position are entirely voluntary, so due consideration should be given when contacting them.

My computer has not been hacked this email address along with treasurer@abccc.com and other ABCCC addresses are



readily available on the website for anyone to use. I would never send an email asking a member to perform a service like buying gift cards for committee members, paying a bill for me or send me personal details because I am tied up in a meeting. If I wanted a member to help me, I would phone first to discuss and the same applies, call me. Scammers are getting more sophisticated, treat every email or phone message with suspicion.

As an aside, when we opened the website many years ago, we were very quickly hacked at committee level, Tony Hodges was selling Viagra, Colin Brown was running a brothel and I was trading porn sites to all committee members, it got so bad we cancelled all club addresses. Some interesting details that I found on the 'Detroit Electric vehicle'

Interesting to read that the Detroit Electric car was produced by the Anderson Electric Company in Detroit Michigan, they built 13,000 electric cars from 1907 to 1939

The cars were advertised as reliably getting 80 miles (130 km) between battery recharging, although in one test a Detroit Electric ran 211.3 miles (340.1 km) on a single charge. Top speed was only about 20 mph (32 km/h), but this was considered adequate for driving within city or town limits at the time.


The Detroit Electric was mainly sold to women drivers and physicians who desired the dependable and immediate start without the physically demanding hand cranking of the engine that was required with early internal combustion engine autos.


Women drivers preferred the Detroit Electric vehicle as it did not have to be started with a starter handle. It was seen as a luxury vehicle for shopping and social visits around town. Its advertising featured groups of unescorted

women in furs, feathers and fine clothes going off to a reception, theatre, tea or dance in their Detroit Electric described as "elegant comfort and independent privacy" and "Society's Town Car". Electric cars were perceived as safer than petrol cars and therefore more suitable for women.

During the First World War the cost of petrol doubled in Australia and electric cars became so popular that in 1914 Sydney City Council set up a special charging station in Palmer Street, where owners could recharge their vehicles for a reasonable fee. At this time it was expected that the petrol engine would soon become obsolete, but the electric car continued to be hampered by its heavy batteries. The inability to find a cheap and easy-to-produce alternative battery, the limited range of the electric car, and its lower maximum speed, helped the petrol car to become dominant.

The Disney cartoon character Grandma Duck drives a red car with license plate number "1902" that appears similar to a Detroit Electric.
