### **CLUB PERMIT SCHEME**

ABCCC is a VicRoads authorised Club to participate in the VicRoads Club Permit Scheme (CPS)

The ABCCC has set rules & conditions for operating a motor vehicle [twenty-five (25) years old and older on the CPS, for further information about how the CPS is conducted by the All British Classics Car Club please visit the club's Website Link ABCCC Club Permit Scheme information All the information is available online.

- 1. **Initial contact** should be made with the club's Vehicle Logbook Club Permit Scheme (VLCPS) Applications Officer, currently Wally Thompson. He will advise the procedure for application with respect to the conditions set by the ABCCC. He must also provide a first inspection of the vehicle.
- 2. **PERMIT RENEWALS** VicRoads requires that an ABCCC authorised VLCPS Officer's signature is entered on the permit renewal notice. Therefore, your VLCPS renewal should be sent to Colin Brown, PO Box 40, Coldstream, Victoria 3770. Enclose with it a stamped envelope addressed to VicRoads, along with a cheque/money order for the VLCPS fee. Colin will sign on behalf of the ABCCC and then forward the permit renewal on to VicRoads. The form also requires YOUR signature, so be sure to sign it as the permit holder as well.

Both Wally & Colin's position are entirely voluntary, so due consideration should be given when contacting them.

## Jaguar Mark V Project Feb. 25

Not a lot of progress over the last three months, a lot of time still spent searching for parts, you would think with the mechanicals completed and the body three quarters finished there is not many boxes of bits left so finding bits should be easy. The latest is the petrol flap catch, I know it came in one of the many boxes because I have seen it and didn't know what it was, but after hours of searching it hasn't shown up. Of course, I will find it while looking for something else.

I finally got the woodwork back and spent over two weeks fitting it, some of the original wood was too worm infested to save and had to be renewed so consequently I had to re-work them to fit without damaging the veneer. I am very pleased with the result.

I finally got a few panels back from the spray painter, so it has now got a bonnet and skirts and finally the radiator grill and mascot. The big hold up at the moment are the front guards and it looks like I won't get them until April/May. Of course, a lot of my time goes into things you don't see, like wiring and adjusting panel gaps, still not finished to my satisfaction and probably never will be.



### **A Mobility Scooter Experience** by Mike Allfrey

Back in June 2024, I purchased an electric mobility scooter. That is a really weird industry to become involved with. I found a seller that seemed approachable in Ringwood and while still driving the Rover, struck a deal for a fairly upmarket model and had it delivered. At the time of purchase, they accepted my request for communication via email – that was written on the invoice, no less. The scooter was immediately lacking in performance, with the selection of Hi range making no difference at all! Using the Hi range brought on a surging motion that was akin to a 1949 Ferguson with a clapped-out engine governor! I sent them four emails and over a period of two months received no response. I printed off all the emails and posted them in a large envelope, registered mail. Finally, a month later, I took a taxi to the Ringwood dealership and met a 'stone wall.' The response was that no emails had been received, the printed material had not arrived and then the

amazing response to my concern, "We have sold hundreds of your model scooter and never had a complaint, that means there is nothing wrong with your scooter."

I then wrote to the Department of Consumer Affairs (Victoria) and they turned out to be worse than useless. They replied a month later with a Case Number and the single word 'OFFICIAL' in the middle of the message.

My concern is that I purchased in good faith a rather expensive mobility scooter that did not at all meet the printed specifications. The maximum ground speed was quoted as being 14 to 15 kph, in high range that is selectable with a rotary switch on the control panel. Rotating the switch to Hi resulted in no speed change at all. The scooter managed 9 to 10 kph, with a severe surge motion that felt like it had been restrained in the rear, let go and then grabbed again.

The User's Manual is virtually useless, it tells me to check and keep the battery terminals clean. That is all very well but how on earth does a mortal get access to the blasted batteries – no mention of that! It is the same with the front wheel bearings, which need to be lubricated periodically but no mention of how to go about it. The damn thing has been taken back for repair, returned and is no better.

### The Saga Continues

Since mid-June the problem has been ongoing, in October the scooter was collected for repair, and I was housebound until Christmas Eve when a red lesser model was delivered by a taxi driver. The loan scooter is dreadful to drive, has serious rattles underneath, an intermittent graunching noise and loud rattles from the front axle area. On any slope that angles left or right, that is the direction it takes! Quite violent.

Sue has taken to ringing the dealer every day, they are well aware of our dissatisfaction with the service provided. The latest news is that they are waiting for a new electric motor to arrive from China. Sue reminded them that there are numerous flights from China and why couldn't they utilise one of them? Female logic? We still cannot get an estimate for the repair completion. Meanwhile the kilometres are accumulating on the red loaner.

Reference the photo above – DO NOT BUY ONE OF THESE! Better still, don't get old!
